**BOND ORDER**

Defendant is before the Court on a Motion for Reconsideration and Motion for Bond or in the alternative for Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law. A hearing on this motion was held on November 23, 2020.

Seven witnesses testified at the hearing in support of Defendant's motion. Four of these witnesses are active duty law enforcement officers. These witnesses testified that Defendant poses no significant risk of fleeing from the jurisdiction, that he is not a significant threat or danger to any person or the community, that he poses no significant risk of committing any felony pending trial, and that he poses no significant risk of intimidating witnesses or otherwise obstructing the administration of justice. Additionally, there was testimony that there are no concerns of civil unrest should a bond be granted in this case. Finally, there was evidence presented that should the Defendant be released on bond that he will have employment.

**WHEREFORE**, having considered the evidence presented at this hearing and the prior bond hearing, it appears that the Defendant meets the criteria of O.C.G.A. §17-6-1(e) and shall be granted a bond; said bond to be conditioned on the following:

1. Defendant is awarded a bond in the amount of \$100,000.00, cash or property.
2. Defendant shall not have any contact with the victim's family or any witness in this case, nor shall the Defendant solicit others to contact the victim's family or any witness in this case.
3. Defendant shall not leave the Ogeechee Judicial Circuit for any reason. The Ogeechee Judicial Circuit is comprised of the counties of Bulloch, Effingham, Jenkins, and Screven.
4. Defendant shall maintain employment.
5. Defendant shall not possess weapons.
6. Defendant shall not partake alcoholic beverages or any drugs not legally prescribed.
7. Defendant shall not violate any laws.
